Teenage harp virtuoso, **Melody Lindsay**, and the Trebles of the Lutheran Church of Honolulu Choir will present a very special holiday concert featuring Benjamin Britten's *A Ceremony of Carols*, John Rutter's *Tomorrow Shall Be My Dancing Day*, as well as Paul Hindemith's *Sonata for Harp* and other holiday favorites. Carl Crosier will conduct.

A 17 year old high school senior, Melody Lindsay has been described as "captivating" by the *Honolulu Advertiser* and "a harp phenom" by the *Honolulu Star-Bulletin*. This past summer, Melody received outstanding reviews from the International panel of harpists at the World Harp Congress in Amsterdam, the Netherlands, and was awarded the Deane Sherman Fellowship, given in honor of the founder of the World Harp Congress. Melody is the recipient of the first Dora Derby Award from the Honolulu Symphony Associates and a 2008 Morning Music Club Scholarship. She is the youngest harpist to receive the Mildred Biehn Johnson Award for "outstanding musical promise" from the American Harp Society of the Western Hemisphere. She has performed on NPR's *From the Top*, is a popular performer on YouTube, and gives cultural leadership recitals and lectures throughout the United States and Europe.
