Message from Pastor

I would like to respond via the newsletter to a few questions I have frequently heard of late. The first is, "Pastor, what are you getting from the ohang gatherings?" The small group meetings in people's homes have given me the opportunity to get to know many of you much better and to understand what draws you to this family of God from all over the island. I also am better able to tailor the intentional interim ministry for this unique congregation and not replicate earlier efforts by the Ministry Plan Task Force and others. Perhaps more importantly, it allows me to experience your genuine affection for one another and your



strong desire for both spiritual feeding and opportunities to employ your God-given gifts.

At each of the 11 gatherings I have attended thus far. I have heard an expressed desire to

continue small group opportunities as a way of enhancing and deepening relationships among members and to meet real needs. Expect to hear more about this soon as the various church ministry teams are encouraged to develop small group opportunities at the church and elsewhere in the community.

The second question is, "Why would anyone want to hear what I have to say? I'm not formally a member anyway." I care about what you have to say and others have demonstrated at these gatherings that they want to hear how others experience worship and ministry here. Whether friend, visitor, or member, each can help inform and shape how we invite others to join us in our spiritual walk, worship together, and

minister to others. You lessen that transformation by withholding your thoughts, experiences, and dreams. I therefore invite you to take the risk and join one of the upcoming Ohana Gatherings.

"What will you do with the information?" The Transition Team is already collating information received to date and is looking for trends and opportunities to pass on to LCH ministries, the Call Committee, and the Congregation.

My additional response to the last question is another: "What will you do with the information?" As Pastor David Barber often reminded you, this is YOUR congregation, YOUR ministry to the glory of God. I encourage you to ask yourselves what themes you hear, what needs are expressed, what possibilities are opened up, what dreams can be made realities.

You should know that, despite severe declines in funds to our synod that resulted in the elimination of one of three staff positions and a reduction in the travel budget, our Bishop agreed that it was important he send his assistant to support us at this stage in the interim process. During her week here, Pastor Karen Parker attended several LCH activities, provided our call committee with training and information on candidates, preached, and led a forum about the call process between services. I want to publicly thank them for such stellar support.

While no one yet knows who your next pastor might be or when s/he will arrive, clearly there is much to be done in enhancing the ministry and processes of LCH to which s/he will be invited.

Stewardship, an "R-rated" term for many, is one of those areas you have told me needs addressing. I have thus recommended to the Finance Committee and church council that we take a comprehensive approach to stewardship this year through a full-blown campaign.

As you read of the plan elsewhere in the Heart Beat, I encourage you to give the committee your full support and to prayer fully consider your involvement. Please contact one of them if you are interested in assisting with the campaign.

One of the things I must always keep in mind as your interim pastor is that every thing I do can make it easier or more difficult for the next pastor. In the interest of enhancing communication with you, I want you to know that I have invited Pastor Fritz Fritschel to continue to contribute to the life and ministry of the congregation as he is interested and able. Per ELCA policy, ordained pastors not called to a congregation, including those who retire and remain, shall not exercise ministry functions there unless invited to do so by the pastor. (That policy will apply to me when I conclude my ministry here, too.) He and I have agreed that this verbal contract is for the time of my pastorate and must be renegotiated with the new pastor. Pastor Fritz and Carol have much to teach me, and I have much to learn. I trust you will support that agreement.

Thank you for the support and encouragement you have given me. I look for ward to exploring with you more of the ways in which we can minister to each other and the children of God in Hawaii and beyond.

The summer months were lean times for our LCH operating finances; but the August 31 report shows a much improved, financial position.

Almost #14,000.00 of the August income was from P oki Lot parking, which will not be due again until late December.

Stewardship Campaign

Stewardship is more than a one-Sunday a year event at which members pledge a portion of their treasure towards a church 's budget. Stewardship is an attitude of thanksgiving all year long and a regular intention to use what God has given us to his glory. While prayerful consideration of your financial donation is certainly encouraged to assist the finance committee in determining our budget for the upcoming year, the stewardship campaign will also ask you to prayerfully consider how you might contribute of your time and talent to ministries at, through, or beyond LCH.

This year's campaign will thus begin the first Sunday of October with one of our committees presenting a short "temple talk" during the service, followed by that committee conducting that day's adult forum between services. The series will continue into November, to be concluded by two sequential stewardship Sundays when you will be asked to return pledge cards for time, talent, and treasure. Between services on November 19 and 26 there will be a Ministry Fair at which you will be able to talk in more detail with committee and ministry representatives. Thus those not able to attend one Sunday will have an alternate opportunity.

Information will be mailed to you and posted on the LCH website as it is developed, including pledge cards.

To assist the finance committee in preparing the 2007 budget proposal, all committees, task forces and ministries are asked to submit their requests for funding by October 11.

You are welcome and encouraged to join the newly forming stewardship committee in preparing and conducting this special ministry.

What's new on the LCH website? Bill Potter

The main change you will notice on our website is the creation of a separate "Youth" subsection within the "Children and Youth" section. We hope that it has been completely resolved, but to make sure, we replaced the web pages on the old server with "redirects" that will take people to the current server and our up -to-date information.
