Message from Pastor

For God So Loved the World

By the time you read this article, Christians around the world will be beginning the somber journey into Holy Week. Through the eyes of the synoptic witnesses we hear again the story of Jesus triumphal journey into Jerusalem, his capture and imprisonment, his death on the cross, and the long nights of sorrow following his interment

in the tomb. But on the morning of the third day, Mary finds herself outside the tomb hoping to anoint Jesus' body and give him the dignity he was denied in death, but he is gone! Seeing someone she supposes to be the gardener, she asks, "Where is he, where has he gone?" Jesus



the carpenter, teacher, rebel, healer, pastor, and friend is revealed as Messiah, Savior, resurrected, Son of God, and King of Kings. All of this, because God loves the world—all the world.

As I sit reading the paper this morning, I am deeply thankful that God loves this world with such grace—especially God's love for the human ones. As I skim the paper, I see headlines announcing AIG executive pay bonuses to the tune of 167 million dollars—managers rewarded for greed and poor performance. In Austria, a father is on trial for raping his daughter for 24 years in a soundproof basement. Unemployment is on the rise; greed-driven over-development in Phoenix has fueled a housing crisis that is leaving people wondering how to hang on to shelter; and homeless people in Hawai'i are growing in numbers as people lose jobs. War rages in the Middle East, and whole towns are going bankrupt. In the meantime, genocide in Darfur, hunger in Korea and across Africa, a worldwide AIDS epidemic, and the poisoning of earth and sea are pushed off the front page. It defies logic that God still loves such a world, but God again and again proclaims that love. What an amazing grace.

Of course one cannot judge humanity by newspaper headlines. There are good people out there doing wonderfully good things. Unemployed professionals are using their downtime in service to non-profits. People young and old are finally getting on the green bandwagon, health care and education are becoming more important to the average citizen, and simplicity might be hip again. But this is not an Abraham at Sodom sort of proposal. (Abraham bargained with God to refrain from destroying the city if even a few righteous folks could be found.) Jesus does not die and rise for the righteous few, but for all of creation. Sheep and goats, righteous and sinner, religious and religulous are all bathed with the same Easter morning, the same Easter grace. For some, it is a life changing and enriching experience. For others, the living God is met with a shrug. But neither the gift of Easter nor its power is diminished by indifference, denial, or apathy—even when it happens in God's own church.

God so loves the world that God continues to send God's Son—even now. No recession, depression, obsession, apathy, boredom, anxiety, or fear can overshadow God's brilliant light of graceful love, nor drown out the shouts of those who choose to live it out. Christ is Risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

Finance Update

The world financial crisis affects us all. So we can work together as a community, regular updates on the church's financial health will be in the *HeartBeat* and the Sunday bulletins.

Approximately 40% of the LCH budget is from parking, preschool, and Luther Place. This part of the budget is meeting our predictions. 60% of the LCH budget comes from member and plate offerings. Unfortunately, the member and plate offerings for January and February are running 16% lower than the donations rate for 2008.

This 16% lower rate of donations translates into a possible year end budget shortfall of about 10%, or over \$44,000. While the Church Council will continue to make budget adjustments as possible, there are good things we can do to avoid cuts in our programs.

We can tell our friends and neighbors how LCH is growing as well as tell them how our church, especially in these times of stress, nurtures us. New members will bring new energy and support.

The bottom line from your friendly finance committee: Please keep up those donations!



A Rainbow of Prayer

More than two thousand handmade rainbow scarves were worn at the ELCA Churchwide Assembly in 2007, demonstrating support for a welcoming church. LCH contributed several of these scarves.

In August 2009, the ELCA meets for its next assembly. There are several proposals before the Assembly that pertain to the full inclusion of Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, and Transgender members and their families in the life of the church. Lutherans Concerned/North America (LC/NA) is supporting proposals addressing these issues.

These decisions will be taken with much soul-searching and prayer. To that end, LC/NA would like to provide prayer shawls to be used by participants at the assembly. These shawls will be for use in the chapel area and to remind participants to prayerfully consider every issue.

LC/NA is requesting the participation of all RIC organizations and congregations to contribute at least one shawl.

The shawls may be quilted, woven, crochet, or knit. The size should be about 72" x 18". The design is left up to the person creating the piece. The intent is to have a rainbow of individually colored shawls, but none should be rainbow-colored this time.
